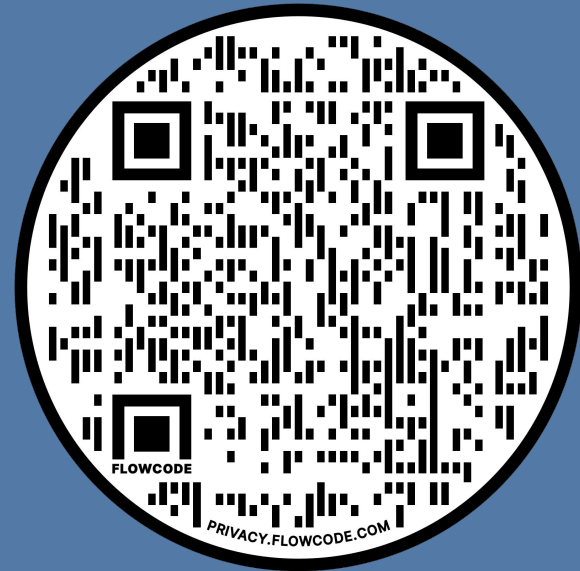

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Careers in Psychology



Dr. Denise Reyes



Denise Reyes is an assistant professor of industrial/organizational psychology. Reyes received her Ph.D. and M.A. in industrial/organizational psychology from Rice University and a B.S. in psychology from the University of Central Florida. Her main research interests revolve around leadership and training. Reyes was selected as the Society for Industrial Organizational Psychology's 2019 Joyce & Thayer Graduate Fellow, demonstrating exceptional research in training and development. Her other research interests include diversity, rejection in the workplace and the psychology of teams. Her research has been published in academic journals such as *Journal of Applied Psychology*, *The Leadership Quarterly* and *American Psychologist*.

Dr. Michael Williams



Dr. Michael W. Williams is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychology and Director of the Measurement and Intervention for Neuropsychological Disorders (MIND) Laboratory. He attended Morehouse College for undergraduate studies and earned his PhD from Wayne State University. He completed a postdoctoral fellowship at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine.

Dr. Dierdre Wood



Dr. Dierdre Wood is a Licensed Specialist in School Psychology. She completed her doctoral internship in the Cypress-Fairbanks Independent School District during the 2018-2019 school year and currently serves as an LSSP at both the elementary and middle school levels. She is also co-leader of the department's Diversity Committee and co-implements the Incredible Years Autism - Parent Training Program. Dr. Wood earned her Doctorate and Master of Science in School Psychology from the University of Central Arkansas and her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from The University of Alabama. Her research interests include racial and ethnic identity, diversity, and executive functioning. In her practice in the school setting, she is particularly interested in behavioral consultation, psychoeducational assessment, and parent training.

Melissa Hamilton Grisdale



Dr. Melissa Grisdale is a Licensed Specialist in School Psychology and Licensed Psychologist. She completed her doctoral internship and post-doctoral fellowship within CFISD. She graduated from the University of Houston with a Bachelor of Science in Human Development and Family Studies and Psychology, as well as a Master's Degree in Counseling from the University of Houston. She then completed her Doctorate in School Psychology at Louisiana State University (Geaux Tigers!). Dr. Grisdale has conducted research on the relationship between multicultural competency and classroom variables such as exclusionary discipline practices, teacher-student relationship, and teacher-self efficacy. Currently, Dr. Grisdale provides psychological services within the elementary school setting. She is particularly interested in restorative justice practices at her campuses. Outside of work, Dr. Grisdale enjoys being outside, running, exploring new places in Houston, and spending time with her husband and two children.

Dr. Audrey Miller



Audrey Miller is Research Associate at the Institute for Research on Women, Gender & Sexuality. She also teaches in WGSS, including the psychology-crosslisted course Gender & Violence.

Dr. Miller's research examines predictors and sequelae of violence against women and marginalized groups, including racial and ethnic minorities, immigrants, sexual minorities, and individuals with disabilities. She has published numerous peer-reviewed articles, book chapters, and conference presentations, in scholarly outlets such as *Sex Roles*, *Psychology of Women Quarterly*, *Violence Against Women*, *Journal of Homosexuality*, *Journal of Interpersonal Violence*, *Group Processes & Intergroup Relations*, *Basic and Applied Social Psychology*, *Journal of Applied Social Psychology*, and *Journal of Counseling Psychology*.

Dr. Miller completed M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in psychology at Ohio University, integrating coursework and scholarship in social psychology, personality psychology, health psychology, and quantitative methods, while completing an APA-accredited clinical program. She then completed a postdoctoral fellowship in law and psychology through the Division of Public Behavioral Health and Justice Policy at University of Washington.
